Chairperson's Report

Season 2014 has been a success across many areas of the club.

A quick summary of the year.

- 22 teams (12 seniors, 10 juniors)
- 13 teams made finals
- 10 teams made Grand Finals
- 3 Premierships
- 2 x junior girl's teams entered. Both in A grade. 1 Premiership
- We took Premier League hockey to Ballarat
- We celebrated the 20 year anniversary of our first State League 1 premiership

Our members make a massive contribution to the game outside of our club

- We have representation on the HV Board
- Our members coach state and representative teams both seniors and juniors
- Our players represent state and national teams (including country teams) at both junior and senior level
- Our members umpire and state and national championships.

We continue to work on the areas we have identified at priorities: growth & development, facility development and revenue.

Growth & development. While our overall junior number remained steady, we now have a clear pathway to increase the participation of girls at our club via the girl's only teams we now have in U14s and U16s. At the other end of the scale we returned to the men's masters' competition with an Over 35s team and intend building on that in 2015.

Facility Development. We have met with council on a number of occasions throughout the year to progress our two priority items relating to facility development – change rooms and pitch resurfacing.

Revenue. We remain in a good positon financially and continue to be very responsible with the management of our money. We are again in a positon to make an allocation to the sinking fund to support our facility development ambitions.

Our sport is attempting to juggle the competing priorities of sustainable growth, fairness of competitions (especially at the elite level) and deliver 1st class performances while essentially still being an amateur sport run and administered primarily by volunteers. Our club has been on the receiving end of some interesting decisions this year which we have dealt with and got on with the task at hand. I expect this trend will continue until the current environment is settled. As we have some of the best and most knowledgeable administrators and support personnel in the game, we need to stay across the issues and influence matters for the good of the game. The next few years could be crucial to the structure of the sport in Victoria into the future.

It's been a privilege to be the Chairman of the Altona Hockey Club in 2014. I appreciate the support given to myself and the rest of the Board by all our members and supporters.

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The 2014 Board

Overview

The Altona Hockey Club Board of Management is elected in accordance with the Constitution to control and manage the club in the best interests of our members. The Board may consist of between five and ten members. For 2014 we had 9 elected members serving on the Board and representing a cross-section of our total membership.

The Board meets monthly throughout the calendar year. Interested persons, including club members are welcome to attend Board meetings as observers in all matters of a non-confidential nature.

Board membership is for a term of two years, within which time Board members undertake an office bearer position or management of a portfolio. Given the size and nature of our club, all Board members are expected to take a 'hands on' approach to club management. However, the success of each portfolio is still heavily reliant on the existence of sub-committees or less formal working groups outside of the Board to assist in operational and administrative activities.

December/January is often the busiest time for the Board as preparations for the following winter season commence.


The 2014 season was a promising step for the men's Premier League and Premier Reserve groups.

Some slight tweaks to the coaching structure saw Stephen Ritchie and Ben Newell take control of the defensive side of things while Aiden Hicks came on board to assist Ben Guy in the forward half. The 3 assistant coaches also worked on a rotational system with the PL reserve group, taking the group in 4 week blocks throughout the year.


Preseason kicked off for the group in mid-November. A training day in early Feb in Anglesea was pivotal for the players in outlining the revised game structures as well as fitness work and testing requirements for the year. Full credit has to go to the players for embracing this fully which saw significant improvement in testing results throughout the group.


We then took the squad to Mount Gambier for a tournament against two premier league clubs from Adelaide as well as a local representative squad. A big thanks to David Howell for all of his hard work in ensuring the trip ran smoothly. This was a great opportunity to introduce the new structural changes to the group in a competitive environment. Four local practice games saw the group peaking for the start of the season and able to get early results and a head start against other teams.

The squad's fitness again continued to improve in 2014 which was a key driver in our early success in the season. The hard work put in by the players in pre-season will be crucial moving into 2015.



Compared to season 2013, the squad was relatively stable in terms of player availability, we were fortunate to have far less injuries which allowed both groups to really gel in the opening part of the season. While this did mean that fewer players got exposure at the premier league level (23 in 2014 compared to 29 in 2013), it did allow the players in that group to really establish themselves in the competition. 34 players were exposed to Premier Reserve in 2014, only 1 fewer than the year before which demonstrates the strong drive over the past couple of years to develop younger players and strengthen the group through exposure to higher levels of hockey.

2014 was probably the best 'combined' result for the Premier League/Premier Reserve teams in a number of years with both teams finishing in the upper half of their competitions and both in the hunt for finals as September drew near.

For Premier Reserve, finishing 5th left a slightly bitter taste after consecutive years of making it through to finals. While a few key losses hurt the final outcome, the season itself was largely a success with many younger players getting the opportunity to experience the premier reserve competition and the group as a whole developing a much stronger understanding of the game plan and style of play.

For premier League, finishing 4th and making finals for the first time in 11 years was a huge achievement. This was set up largely by winning the first 7 games of the year, a testament to the group's pre-season work.

Although the group had some ups and downs throughout the 2014 season, it was really important that they got the opportunity to play finals as this has provided them with a taste of what it takes to make it to a Grand Final. Unfortunately, due to losses against lower sides at key times throughout the year, we put ourselves under unnecessary pressure, and it all came down to our last game against Doncaster. After going down a couple of goals early in the first half, the group bandied together and ground Doncaster down in the second half, to finish with a 4-4 draw, which was enough to see us qualify for our first finals series in 11 years.

The emotion of the players, staff & supporters will stay with me for a long time, but most gratifying was to know just how much it really meant to the players to make finals.

One week later we took the opportunity to challenge Camberwell in the Semi-final, and although the result didn't go our way, we learnt more about what it takes to not just play finals and witnessed what it takes to win one.

Unfortunately, we didn't play to our ability, our basics were impacted by the occasion and we missed some opportunities that could have changed the outcome. While we were all disappointed with the result, sometimes you need to experience disappointment before you can taste success. This should be the theme of the playing group for 2015.

The opportunity for the playing group in 2015 is to replicate the level of investment that each player made in both their fitness and the work they put into pushing each other, week in week out on the training track.

The culture developed over the last 4 years needs to be owned by the playing group, and they need to ensure that they drive each other to improve further in 2015.

My decision to take a year off has been an incredibly hard one to reach, especially given the growth of the group this year. It does however represent a great opportunity for the group to learn more about our great game under a new coach, and I look forward to bringing Fletcher & Jackson down to watch you guys go from good to great in 2015.

- Both our WPL and WPLR teams scored more goals, conceded less goals and finished with more points than in 2013, evidence that we are on the improve
